

WATERSHED APPROACH

To address countywide concerns, the Flood Control District will continue making upgrades to the Harris County Flood Warning System, including countywide flood forecasting capabilities. The Flood Control District will pursue countywide right-of-way acquisition and floodplain preservation, planning projects, partnership projects with the Harris County Engineering Department, and partnership projects with other local municipalities. A countywide effort to remap the regulatory floodplain and other flood hazards in Harris County will also be initiated. Additionally, the Flood Control District has allocated funds to research advanced emerging technologies for flood damage reduction, preliminary engineering reports, and an implementation plan for a large-diameter tunnel system for stormwater conveyance. Funding has been made available for investigating the feasibility of using surplus City of Houston properties as stormwater detention sites, and a contingency fund is available for unanticipated needs that will occur over the course of the next 10 to 15 years.

BENEFITS

Benefits associated with the countywide approach will be quantified as projects are defined and developed.




COMMUNITY INPUT REVIEW PROCESS

Each public comment was considered individually by the Flood Control District. Comments were reviewed to identify and categorize the ideas, concerns, requests, and information presented. This input was then categorized by theme for incorporation into the proposed bond program, and the Flood Control District team responded to each community input comment received. Themes identified for countywide projects are detailed below.

COMMUNITY INPUT SUMMARY

From May 30 through August 3, 2018, the Flood Control District received a total of 25 community input comments related to flood damage reduction concerns for countywide issues that were not limited to one, single watershed. Common themes expressed include requests for home buyouts throughout the county, as well as requests for additional channel modifications, stormwater detention, and flood damage reduction studies.

PUBLIC INPUT THEMES



Comments received relating to countywide concerns and proposed projects include:

- Requests for home buyouts along bayous to be converted into additional stormwater detention facilities
- Requests for the Flood Control District to determine an alternative approach for selection of home buyout areas of concern
- Stormwater detention requests included additional stormwater detention facilities for Brays Bayou, Cypress Creek, and along the Westpark Tollway (Brays Bayou)
- Channel modification requests included general capacity improvements for Harris County watersheds, deepening and widening of Cypress Creek, and modifying channels to accommodate for both stormwater detention and conveyance
- Additional flood damage reduction study requests include possible conveyance improvements to Clear Creek near Nassau Bay, and looking into Clay Road Bridge as a possible obstruction to conveyance for Bear Creek

Additional comments were received that expressed concerns that fall outside of the Flood Control District's jurisdiction, including localized street and drainage improvements in the Bear Creek Estates subdivision. The concerns expressed for countywide projects that fall outside of the Flood Control District's jurisdiction require coordination with other municipalities and/or organizations to address these comments.
