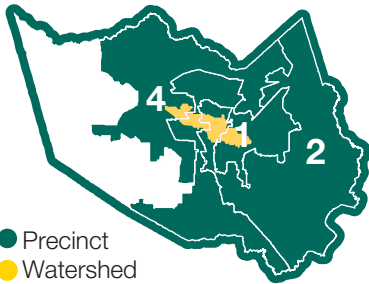

## WATERSHED APPROACH

In the Halls Bayou watershed, the Flood Control District will focus on implementing the recommended projects from the Halls Ahead Planning Study. These projects will include drainage improvements along the following tributaries: P118-08-00, P118-09-00, P118-21-00, P118-23-00, P118-23-02, P118-25-00, P118-25-01, P118-26-00, and P118-27-00. The Flood Control District also plans to implement improvements along the main stem of Halls Bayou in support of the Halls Ahead Planning Study tributary improvements. Several projects will be planned and executed in coordination with the City of Houston in order for the City to complete its identified capital projects in the area. Voluntary home buyouts for structures that meet Flood Control District requirements are also planned for this watershed.

## BENEFITS

Bond Program projects would provide a significant improvement in the general drainage conditions in several areas of the Halls Bayou watershed. Most projects would require right-of-way to be acquired for the needed channel modifications and detention basins.

## COMMUNITY INPUT REVIEW PROCESS

Each public comment was considered individually by the Flood Control District. Comments were reviewed to identify and categorize the ideas, concerns, requests, and information presented. This input was then categorized by theme for incorporation into the proposed Bond Program, and the Flood Control District team responded to each community input comment received. A total of one new “Community Input” project was incorporated into the proposed Bond Program as a result of community input. Themes identified for Halls Bayou watershed are detailed below.

## COMMUNITY INPUT SUMMARY

From May 30 through August 3, 2018, the Flood Control District received a total of 17 community input comments related to flood damage reduction concerns in the Halls Bayou watershed. Common themes and requests expressed through community input include requests for channel modifications, stormwater detention, and concerns that fall outside the Flood Control District’s jurisdiction. Other themes include requests for home buyouts, channel maintenance, and requests for additional flood damage reduction studies.

A common area of concern was flooding between Interstate Highway (IH) 45 and the Hardy Toll Road. Residents in this area expressed the need for channel modifications and channel maintenance and noted significant erosion along Halls Bayou in this segment of the bayou. Stormwater detention was also requested in this area.

Input falling outside of the Flood Control District’s jurisdiction included street drainage improvements in various portions of the watershed, particularly where City of Houston drainage infrastructure is undersized. The concerns expressed within the Halls Bayou watershed that fall outside of the Flood Control District’s jurisdiction require coordination with other municipalities and/or organizations to address these comments.

Community input resulted in the development of the project listed below:
