

WATERSHED APPROACH

In the Hunting Bayou watershed, the Flood Control District will focus on completing the Hunting Bayou Federal Project in the upper portion of the watershed, including the Kashmere Gardens area. The project is already under construction, but the Flood Control District will move to complete the remainder of the project under a single contract, instead of breaking the project into smaller segments. The Flood Control District will also work with the City of Houston to complete the Wallisville outfall project along tributary H103-00-00. Additionally, the Flood Control District will investigate a major diversion of the main stem of Hunting Bayou near Galena Park to provide a bypass for flood flows. Voluntary home buyouts for structures that meet Flood Control District requirements are also planned for this watershed.

BENEFITS

Bond Program projects would benefit residents of the Hunting Bayou watershed by reducing the risk of future flooding through channel conveyance and drainage improvements. Some of these benefits are detailed below:

- The completion of the Hunting Bayou Federal Project is expected to provide flood damage reduction benefits to over 4,000 homes.
- The Wallisville outfall project will address a long-standing drainage and flooding issue.




COMMUNITY INPUT REVIEW PROCESS

Each public comment was considered individually by the Flood Control District. Comments were reviewed to identify and categorize the ideas, concerns, requests, and information presented. This input was then categorized by theme for incorporation into the proposed Bond Program, and the Flood Control District team responded to each community input comment received. Themes identified for Hunting Bayou watershed are detailed below.

A total of two new “Community Input” projects were incorporated into the proposed Bond Program as a result of community input, and one Citizen Service Request was received.

COMMUNITY INPUT SUMMARY

From May 30 through August 3, 2018, the Flood Control District received a total of 17 community input comments related to flood damage reduction concerns in the Hunting Bayou watershed. Common themes expressed include channel maintenance, channel modifications, stormwater detention, and concerns that fall outside the Flood Control District’s jurisdiction. Other community input themes included requests for home buyouts, transparency, and relief from home flooding.

Requests for channel maintenance or modification mostly pertained to Hunting Bayou and its tributaries between Herman Brown Park and Federal Road. In particular, residents noted that tributaries in this region are clogged and in need of debris removal. One resident believed stormwater detention south of Herman Brown Park was undersized, and a separate resident expressed the need for detention between Homestead Road and North Wayside Drive.

Community input that fell outside of the Flood Control District’s jurisdiction included the need for street drainage improvements in various areas. These residents sought for the Flood Control District to partner with the City of Houston to improve drainage infrastructure in the City of Houston. The concerns expressed within the Hunting Bayou watershed that fall outside of the Flood Control District’s jurisdiction require coordination with other municipalities and/or organizations to address these comments.

Community input resulted in the development of the projects listed below:
