

WATERSHED APPROACH

The Flood Control District will focus on completing a general investigation of drainage concerns in the Luce Bayou watershed. The general investigation will involve an analysis of Citizen Service Requests, a review of previous drainage studies, and a public meeting to gather input from citizens. The general investigation will lead to a preliminary engineering report, final design plans, and construction of identified drainage improvement projects. The Flood Control District has very limited property rights in this watershed; however, the Flood Control District is planning to acquire right-of-way in the floodway and floodplain of Luce Bayou for future projects and/or floodplain preservation.

BENEFITS

The proposed investigation and resulting projects would help define drainage benefits in the Luce Bayou watershed. Proposed drainage improvements would allow for planning of future development that could occur in the watershed and address existing drainage problems. Right-of-way acquisition will preserve floodplain areas and attempt to limit development in areas prone to flooding.

COMMUNITY INPUT REVIEW PROCESS

Each public comment was considered individually by the Flood Control District. Comments were reviewed to identify and categorize the ideas, concerns, requests, and information presented. This input was then categorized by theme for incorporation into the proposed Bond Program, and the Flood Control District team responded to each community input comment received. Themes identified for Luce Bayou watershed are detailed below.

COMMUNITY INPUT SUMMARY

From May 30 through August 3, 2018, the Flood Control District received a total of 16 community input comments related to flood damage reduction concerns in the Luce Bayou watershed. Common themes expressed include requests for channel modifications, channel maintenance, and concerns that fall outside the Flood Control District's jurisdiction.

Requests for channel maintenance or modification pertained to Luce Bayou where it meets the East Fork of the San Jacinto River. Community members expressed concerns related to a large sandbar, a potential obstruction, restricts the flow of Luce Bayou into the San Jacinto River. An additional comment requested flood damage reduction projects along Luce Bayou north of FM 2100.

Community input that fell outside of the Flood Control District's jurisdiction included street drainage improvements in various areas. Multiple comments expressed concern over the street drainage in the Water Wonderland and Cypress Point neighborhoods. There was also concern that the water supply channel currently under construction near Wolf Road will increase the flooding in the Luce Bayou watershed. The concerns expressed within the Luce Bayou watershed that fall outside of the Flood Control District's jurisdiction require coordination with other municipalities and/or organizations to address these comments.
